Commissioner Berger: Thank you. Good morning. My name is Henry Berger, Co-Chair of the State Board of Elections. I'm joined by our other Commissioners, my Co-Chair Peter Kosinski, and Commissioners Essma Bagnuola and Anthony Casale. I call to order the March 17th, 2026 meeting of the New York State Board of Elections.

I do not believe we have any old business. Hearing nobody raising any issue, we will move to new business.

The first item of new business concerns amendments to the Voter Registration Form and the accompanying instructions, Resolution 26-03. Would Counsels' office please walk us through the resolution?

Brian Quail: I think Ray wanted to say something.

Raymond Riley: Yeah, I'm happy to take it. So we're doing two updates to the form. The first is we are updating the languages. At the end of last year, based on our analysis due to the John Lewis Voting Rights Act, three languages were added in New York State. Those were Tagalog, Malayalam, and Urdu. The top section of the form for English, we list out in those languages a way for individuals to contact the Board to get those forms and other materials in their language.

Additionally, we're doing an update to section 12, which is the ID section to just clarify and better represent our current interpretation. So those are the two changes to the form.

Brian Quail: I think that's perfect.

Thomas Connolly: What section?

Brian Quail: It's for section 13.

Raymond Riley: Section 13, sorry.

Commissioner Berger: Section 13. Thank you.

Raymond Riley: Thank you.

Henry Berger: I will entertain a motion on Resolution 26-03.

Commissioner Casale: So moved.

Commissioner Berger: Is there a second?

Commissioner Bagnuola: Second.

The second item of new business is an upgrade to the KNOWiNK electronic poll book system. Wow. Resolutions 26-04. Election Operations, I believe, is going to handle this. Would you provide us an overview?

Amy Connolly: Yes. Thank you, Commissioner. KNOWiNK presented for testing PollPad version 4.2.1. The Operations Secure Elections Center has completed that testing – functional and security – and it has met all requirements. Notably, in that configuration, Generation 6 will no longer be supported, and it does also introduce a new printer, and it is also being presented with multiple operating system versions so that counties can still utilize Generation 7 through present.

Commissioner Berger: Thank you. I will entertain a motion on Resolution 26-04.

Commissioner Kosinski: I'll move it.

Commissioner Berger: Is there a second?

Commissioner Casale: Second.

Commissioner Berger: Thank you. Any discussion, questions, concerns? Hearing none, let's proceed to a vote. All those in favor, please indicate by saying aye.
