Using the ATI	
<p>The Audio Tactile Interface is an assistive device that enables voters with visual, cognitive, or mobility impairments to complete a ballot. However, anyone wishing to use this device may do so.</p>	
<p>The audio-tactile interface is also known as the ATI.</p>	
<p>Audio is used to convey information over headphones,</p>	
<p>and tactile controls allow you to convey information to the voting system.</p>	
<p>The ImageCast gives instructions on how to use the ATI, and create your ballot.</p>	
<p>You will see the functions of the input keys from the selected device.</p>	 
<p>You may pause the session or</p>	

<p>request assistance by selecting the Help button.</p>	
<p>The screen displays an image of the ballot which can be adjusted through your controls for optimum viewing.</p>	
<p>Size is adjusted with the Zoom settings, and</p>	
<p>Color is adjusted with the Contrast settings.</p>	
<p>You learn how contests and selections are displayed and can review your selections.</p>	
<p>If no selection is made within certain period of time, the instructions are repeated.</p>	
<p>When you are satisfied with all selections, a paper ballot is printed and deposited into a privacy sleeve.</p>	
<p>Once printed, you may review the ballot through the scanner for verification.</p>
